



H O L Y A N G E L S

- Located in Belmont, NC, Holy Angels was founded by the Sisters of Mercy in 1956.
- The facility has developed over the past 52 years to meet the changing needs of children and adults with mental retardation and physical disabilities, many of whom are medically fragile.
- Holy Angels is a not-for-profit, tax-exempt charitable organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.
- Holy Angels is committed to providing the highest quality of programs and services for 75 residents currently ranging in ages from 1 year old to 66.
- Programs and services include: residential services, medical and nursing care, special education, physical therapy, social work, communication therapy, nutrition, creative arts, horticulture therapy, vocational training, active treatment, life skills, recreation and spiritual growth.
- Our facilities include:

Holy Angels Morrow Center (named after Holy Angels first resident, Maria Morrow, who continues to live and work at Holy Angels)

- Provides 24-hour care for **13 children**, ages 65 months to 18, with severe or profound mental retardation, who require the highest level of intensive care, due to their complex medical and physical challenges.
- The Holy Angels special education school program and Little Angels Child Development Center are also housed in the Morrow Center.

ICF/MR Group Homes - Intermediate Care Facilities (ICF) for the Mentally Retarded (MR)

- Five homes that provide 24-hour care for **48 residents**, ages 5 - 65, most of whom are also in the severe/profound range of mental retardation, have multiple physical disabilities and are medically fragile.

Community Group Homes

- These four households serve as home for **15 residents** with mild/moderate mental retardation.
- Group home managers live with the residents and assist with independent living and social skills.
- Most residents participate in our Vocational Program through Cherubs Café or Candy Bouquets and attend Great Adventures, our social club for adults with and without mental retardation.

Cherubs Café and Candy Bouquets by Holy Angels in Historic Downtown Belmont

- Two shops on Main Street that provide **employment and vocational training** for adults with mental retardation.
- The café offers full service from a gourmet menu of coffee, sandwiches, and ice cream.
- The Candy Bouquets Shop offers an alternative type of gift; an edible candy bouquet, made by our residents, using decorative and delicious candy. Catering is available.

Camp Hope

- A beautiful camp on the South Fork River outside Belmont, where residents can enjoy a fully handicapped accessible nature trail, rides on the river and fishing from the dock.
- An air-conditioned and heated lodge is available for special activities and cookouts.
