Our History

Founded by the Sisters of Mercy, Holy Angels began 54 years ago, with the birth of Maria, who was not expected to live. Maria's mother brought her child to the Sisters of Mercy for care and keeping during the day. The sisters were then asked if they could care for Maria, permanently, because her medical needs were so great.



The sisters agreed and took Maria. The story of the unconditional love the sisters gave Maria was shared with many, and before long, more special babies began to arrive. Holy Angels was born.



Today, Holy Angels continues to provide much needed specialized residential care and innovative services for 75 children and adults from the ages of 2 to 68. We remain a sponsored mission of the Sisters of Mercy, but are a private, non-profit 501(c)(3) corporation.

Maria Morrow has celebrated her 54th birthday and is Holy Angels' true ambassador. She is employed as Holy Angels' receptionist and is the friendly voice that greets you when you call. She also works at Holy Angels Cherubs Candy Bouquet, in downtown Belmont.

Our Programs

Specialized Community Residential Center—Housed in the **Morrow Center** and named for Holy Angels' first resident, these children receive 24-hour care, medical services, special education, physical therapy, speech, music, horticulture and creative arts therapy. The **Morrow Center** is also home to the **Dr. C. Ellis Fisher Health Care Center**, a 24-hour specialized medical care center for residents, operated by Holy Angels and staffed with registered nurses and licensed medical staff.



ICF Group Homes (Intermediate Care Facility)—Moody Place and Belhaven (15-beds) and the Fox Run homes (6-beds each) (Brookview, Oakcrest & Pinehaven) are Holy Angels Intermediate Care Facilities. Moody Place and Belhaven house a state-of-the-art sensory learning facility, known as the Snoezelen Room. Residents receive 24-hour care, special education, vocational, and daily living skills training. Located on the Holy Angels campus, these homes along with two community group homes, are known as the **McAuley Residences**, named in honor of the Sisters of Mercy and in memory of their Foundress, Catherine McAuley.

Community Group Homes—Holy Angels has (4) Community Group Homes - **Gary & Carrabaun** (on-campus) and **Lakewood & South Point** (in the Belmont community). This program serves adults with intellectual disabilities in a home-like environment that challenges each resident to attain his/her highest level of independence. Each home provides residential support services through live-in staff.



Cherubs Cafe and Candy Bouquet—These are two small businesses operated by Holy Angels in order to provide vocational training and meaningful employment opportunities for adults with intellectual disabilities. **Cherubs**, which has been in operation for over 10 years, is located on Main Street in Downtown Belmont, North Carolina and open Monday-Saturday.

Camp Hope—Specifically designed for Holy Angels' residents, this facility, established nearly 15 years ago, offers recreational relaxation for people with disabilities. **Camp Hope** is located in Belmont on the South Fork River and provides residents the opportunity to catch fish, dip their feet in water, take a ride on a boat, or simply enjoy relaxing by the river.



Great Adventures Club—For more than 15 years, this community outreach program has offered adults with and without intellectual disabilities, opportunities for leadership, recreational, spiritual and social experiences.

Little Angels Child Development Center—Our on-site day care for pre-school children of Holy Angels employees. For nearly 20 years, this program has provided the perfect opportunity for children with, and without, disabilities to play and learn from one another.
